VISITOR SICK POLICY

To help offer a safe and healthy environment for all, the following Sick Policy must be followed. This policy was created in consultation with information from the Center for Disease Control and the New York State Department of Health and Office for Child and Family Services. General

All staff and guests are required to take temperature checks upon arrival. If a person's temperature exceeds 100° F, the individual may not enter the PRC.

Staff, essential visitors, and participants in childcare programs (including Me Time, Kids Night In, Camp and SV) must answer a day-of health assessment screening prior to work/program participation, which has additional restrictions. The assessment can be found [here](#). Answers will be kept confidential.

Do not participate in programming/visit if:

1. You had any COVID-19 symptoms within the last 14 days, including:

Fever (above 100° F), cough, shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, chills, fatigue, muscle pain, sore throat, congested or runny nose, new loss of taste or smell that cannot be attributed to another health condition, headache, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea, *unless you have received a negative COVID-19 test and have been symptom and fever free for 24 hours without fever medication.*

2. You or a member of your household are currently required by the Department of Health to be under isolation/quarantine due to *positive COVID-19 test, close contact with COVID-19 or travel.*

3. You have:

- Abdominal pain
- Streptococcal pharyngitis (strep throat or other streptococcal infection), until 24 hours after antibiotic treatment has started.
- Head lice or scabies, until after the first treatment
- Chickenpox (varicella), until all lesions have dried or crusted (usually six days after onset of rash).
- Rubella, until six days after rash appears.
- Pertussis, until five days of appropriate antibiotic treatment.
- Mumps, until five days after onset of parotid gland swelling.
- Measles, until four days after onset of rash.
- Roseola
- Hepatitis A virus infection
- Impetigo, until treatment has been started.
- Flu
- Any other communicable disease

Visitors who express/demonstrate inability to follow the sick policy will be asked to leave by the supervisor and may be prevented from returning until a period of quarantine, as determined by the Center Manager.

In cases of viral outbreaks such as the Coronavirus (COVID-19), please follow any CDC recommendations for prevention, self-care or quarantine following exposure to the virus (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-nCoV>).
