VISITOR SICK POLICY

To help offer a safe and healthy environment for all, the following Sick Policy must be followed. This policy was created in consultation with information from the Center for Disease Control and the New York State Department of Health and Office for Child and Family Services and Steuben County Public Health. General

All staff and guests are required to self-screen before entering the center. PRC staff may ask screening questions and/or check temperatures during periods of highly contagious airborne disease

Guests are instructed not to enter if they do not pass the health screening or if they qualify for Quarantine or Isolation according to NYS Dept. of Health guidelines or if they have experienced the following symptoms in the last 48 hours:

Fever (above 100° F), cough, vomiting or diarrhea

Do not participate in programming/visit if:

1. You meet the General conditions above
2. You have:
 - Abdominal pain
 - Streptococcal pharyngitis (strep throat or other streptococcal infection), until 24 hours after antibiotic treatment has started.
 - Head lice or scabies, until after the first treatment
 - Chickenpox (varicella), until all lesions have dried or crusted (usually six days after onset of rash).
 - Rubella, until six days after rash appears.
 - Pertussis, until five days of appropriate antibiotic treatment.
 - Mumps, until five days after onset of parotid gland swelling.
 - Measles, until four days after onset of rash.
 - Roseola
 - Hepatitis A virus infection
 - Impetigo, until treatment has been started.
 - Flu
 - Any other communicable disease or symptoms of a communicable disease within the last 48 hours

Visitors who express/demonstrate inability to follow the sick policy will be asked to leave until health conditions comply.

In cases of viral outbreaks such as the Coronavirus (COVID-19), please follow NYS Department of Health recommendations for prevention, self-care or quarantine following exposure to the virus (<https://coronavirus.health.ny.gov/home>)
