VISITOR SICK POLICY

To help offer a safe and healthy environment for all, the following Sick Policy must be followed. This policy was created in consultation with information from the Center for Disease Control and the New York State Department of Health and Office for Child and Family Services and Steuben County Public Health. General

All staff and guests are required to self-screen before entering the center and are instructed not to enter if they

- Have flu-like symptoms; or
- Have tested positive for COVID within the last 10 days, or have been directed to quarantine, isolate or self-monitor at home for the coronavirus by any doctor, hospital, or health agency; or
- Have recently had close contact with a person testing positive for COVID (unless you have recovered from COVID within the past 3 months or are fully vaccinated).

Do not participate in programming/visit if:

1. You meet the General conditions above
2. You have:
 - Abdominal pain
 - Streptococcal pharyngitis (strep throat or other streptococcal infection), until 24 hours after antibiotic treatment has started.
 - Head lice or scabies, until after the first treatment
 - Chickenpox (varicella), until all lesions have dried or crusted (usually six days after onset of rash).
 - Rubella, until six days after rash appears.
 - Pertussis, until five days of appropriate antibiotic treatment.
 - Mumps, until five days after onset of parotid gland swelling.
 - Measles, until four days after onset of rash.
 - Roseola
 - Hepatitis A virus infection
 - Impetigo, until treatment has been started.
 - Flu
 - Any other communicable disease

Visitors who express/demonstrate inability to follow the sick policy will be asked to leave by the supervisor and may be prevented from returning until a period of quarantine, as determined by the Center Manager.

In cases of viral outbreaks such as the Coronavirus (COVID-19), please follow any CDC recommendations for prevention, self-care or quarantine following exposure to the virus (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-nCoV>).
